Not Alone

On this feast of The Most Holy Trinity, we read about the mystery and beauty of the triune divine presence. Moses is alone on Mt. Sinai and told by God to remain unaccompanied, that ***even the flocks and the herds are not to go grazing*** (verse 3) while he is standing. Imagine the ethereal atmosphere of this scene: the mountain is fogged in, only objects close up can be identified. Moses can see little beyond himself. Suddenly, he knows he is no longer alone. As he feels unsettled by this unseen presence, he hears his name being called. So great was the power of this voice that Moses instinctively bows ***down to the ground in worship***. (verse 8). And then he hears the most amazing portrayal of this mysterious presence. The description instantly dissipates Moses' fear and astounds his faith: ***a merciful and gracious God, slow to anger and rich in kindness and fidelity*** (verse 6).

STEWARDSHIP & THE HOLY TRINITY...

In the Gospel of *Matthew 28:19* we hear Jesus instruct his Apostles, *Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.* This is, of course, one of many references in Holy Scripture to the Holy Trinity which we celebrate on this Solemnity today.

When we receive the Eucharist at Mass, we are receiving more than the body, blood, soul, and divinity of Jesus Christ; we are also receiving the Father and the Holy Spirit because they are all One. This concept of Three Persons in one God is surely a mystery beyond our comprehension. We take this belief on faith as part of our Catholic beliefs because our human brains can never fully understand it.

When we were confirmed, we received the Holy Spirit, but we also received the Father and the Son as well. When we look at the Tabernacle which is in every Catholic Church throughout the world, we know that Christ is present, but the Father and the Holy Spirit are as well. They all dwell in heaven which means that our Tabernacle might be called a “gateway to heaven.”

Do we think of all this when we come into the church, when we attend Mass? We should. The Holy Trinity is present there every hour of every day and every day of every month and every year. That is one of the reasons we need to attend Mass — to understand and celebrate the Holy Trinity. Ω



STEWARDSHIP & SAINT ANTHONY...



St. Anthony of Padua is one of the most beloved and admired saints in the Church. Because he was a prolific preacher and witness to the Gospel in his personal life, he is known as a great stewardship saint.

St. Anthony was born on the Feast of the Assumption in Lisbon, Portugal, in 1195 to a wealthy and educated family of the Portuguese nobility. He entered the Augustinian religious community at an early age where he devoted himself to the study of sacred scripture and Latin classics.

He joined the Franciscan Order when he was 26 years old and traveled tirelessly to preach what it meant to live according to the Gospel. He is believed to have made as many as 400 trips to towns in both northern Italy and southern France.

St. Anthony knew that preaching was not enough to help people understand how to live according to the Gospel. He believed he had to give witness to the Gospel by the way he lived his personal life. He adopted and maintained a simple lifestyle consistent with what he believed the Gospel was calling him. **St. Anthony** died in Padua, Italy, on June 13, 1231 at the age of 36.

He was proclaimed a saint less than one year after his death. So simple, yet compelling and inspiring was **St. Anthony's** teaching of the Catholic faith that he was declared a Doctor of the Church by **Pope Pius XII** in 1946.

Best known for his patronage of seekers of lost items, St. Anthony is commonly referred to today as the “*finder of lost articles.*” Few people know that he is the patron of many other causes including the poor and those who travel. **His feast day is June 13.** Ω

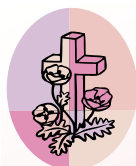

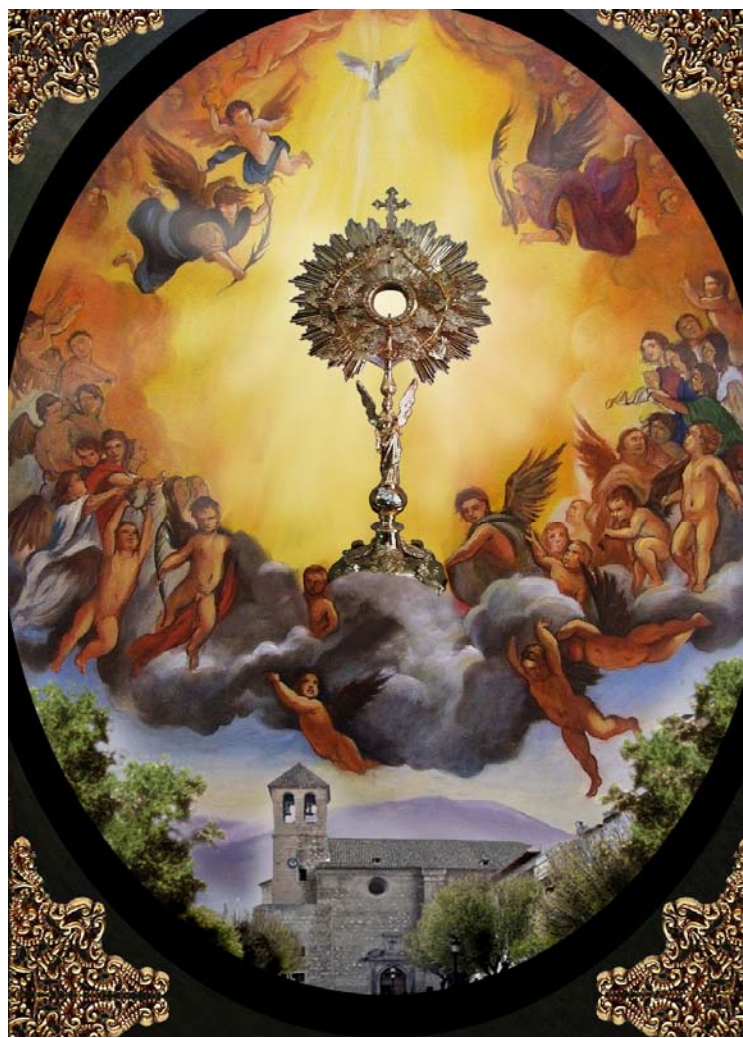

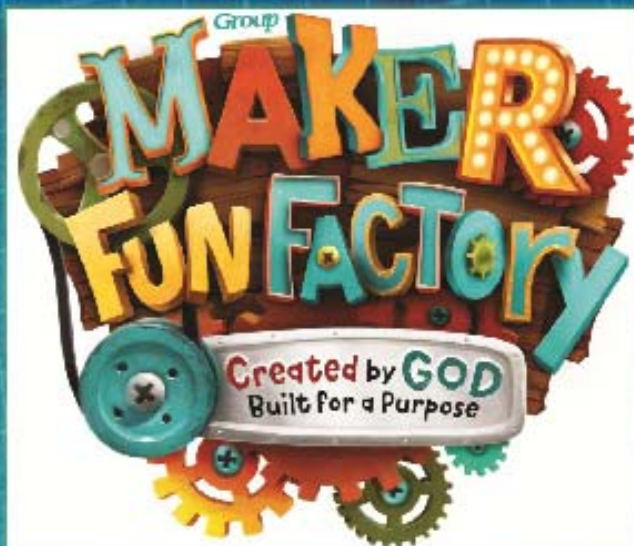
We are having a Eucharistic
