What kind of fruit?...

I finally planted my high-quality citrus tree! Nothing can be more disheartening than to labor for weeks and months in anticipation of collecting the fruit of my labors, only to find that the seemingly healthy plant produced no fruit. I went to great lengths inquiring about a remedy for the problem of a plant that doesn't produce any fruit. Why? Because the whole purpose of cultivating the tree was to enjoy its fruit. Fruit by its nature is the reproductive element of the plant. The nature of fruit is that it contains the seeds to produce new plants. Fruit is the excessive life of the plant; its overabundance. If a plant only receives enough nourishment to survive it will not produce fruit. If the plant is robust with health this extra nourishment is channeled into the production of fruit. So... the question that comes to my mind from today's Gospel is: *About what kind of fruit is Jesus speaking?* It appears that Jesus knows that this kind of life for us comes only through Him. He does not put the stress on being fruitful, but rather the need for us to be intimately attached to Him; living our life in union with Him and allowing His life to permeate us. This is where the fruit comes from! The ability to see Christ's life in us reproduced in others by our words, actions and attitudes...so much so, that they are attracted to the faith. Now that's uncomplicated, healthy fruit!

Stewardship....Live It!

“Children, let us love not in word or speech,
but in deed and truth.”

2 John 3: 18

STEWARDSHIP & DEEDS...

Saint John captures the essence of what kind of love is expected from us toward our neighbor and those in need as he opens our *Second Reading* with “Let us love not in word or speech but in deed and truth.” Jesus made that point several times in His own teachings. It follows the old adage that “Actions speak louder than words.”

We have pointed out numerous times that being a good steward requires action. It may be easy for us to come to an understanding of what it means to love one another; additionally, we may speak of doing it, but the true measure is what we do, how we live our lives.

The best examples of stewardship of which we may be aware in our parishes and community involve what we see and experience in others. That is the most effective way to be taught and it is the best way to teach others. Do it and live it.

That is **John’s** point is it not? He continues his instructions in the *Second Reading* by saying, *We should believe in the name of his Son Jesus Christ, and love one another as He commanded us.* The Norwegian playwright and poet **Henrik Ibsen**, who had a great appreciation for the written word, once stated, *A thousand words will not leave so deep an impression as one deed.*

The point of Jesus’ Parable of the Two Sons (*Mt 21*) in which one son says he will do his father’s will but does, not while the other says he will not obey, but repents and does what his father asked, is quite clear that deeds mean more than intentions. Ω



STANDING ON THE SHOULDERS OF GIANTS...

The late **Monsignor Cosmo Saporito**, our St. Bernadette Parish Grandfather, was fond of saying when he was speaking to parish groups about a particular challenge: *We stand on the shoulders of giants. There are so many who have gone before who have put us where we are today, so that we can move ahead and accomplish what must be done.*

The concept of “standing on the shoulders of giants” (in Latin *nanos gigantum humeris insidentes*) was not an original idea, but Monsignor used it well and wisely. The first recorded use of the idea is attributed to St. Bernard of Chartres, who wrote one thousand years ago, *We are like dwarfs (those of us living now) sitting on the shoulders of giants (those who came before). Our glance can thus take in more things and reach farther than theirs. It is not because our sight is sharper nor our height greater; it is that we are elevated by their stature.* The English scientist, **Sir Isaac Newton**, said something similar attributing his discoveries and revelations to those who preceded him, as he stated, *If I have seen further, it is by standing on the shoulders of giants.*

Our St. Bernadette Parish and Family are what they are today, because we, too, have stood on the shoulders of giants. **Monsignor Saporito** is, of course, one of those giants. To be sure, there have been literally 100’s of people going back to our beginnings in 2001 who have provided us the foundation, the inspiration, and even the perspiration to make us what we are today. There is no way we can mention them all, and there is always a fear that if you mention any, you run the risk of missing someone, because many were giants of whom we were not even aware.

One whom we must always remember, and to whom we owe so much is **Biaggio (Ray) Battaglia**. Not only did **Ray** serve as the chair of our first Stewardship Committee, **Ray** was almost omnipresent in the parish in so many ways, not the least of which was daily Mass down front in the center section on the right with his wife **Millie**. **Millie** is still there. **Ray** died on January 8 this year at the age of 95. At 90 he had returned to the Stewardship Council and was serving again. We thank him; we love him; we miss him. He was a giant indeed.
