Dear Friends,

Each year at this time, it seems that we become hit with a different strain of flu... powerful, fast spreading, and, if not treated, even deadly. If we can take this and expand it one thousand times, we still would not appreciate what it would be like to contract leprosy (*now known as Hansen's Disease*), especially in the days of Jesus. Leprosy isolated, stigmatized, and was terminal. Jesus cured a man with that horrid disease in the Gospel... praise be to Him! His power, however, goes far deeper than being able to cure dreaded diseases. Jesus forgives sin, our sin. And Jesus heals us from the wound and decay that sin brings to us... praise be to Him!

As we are poised now to enter the holy season of Lent, may we cling to Him even more. We do this by prayer, by fasting from what would distract us from Him, and by finding Him in others, as we serve them through act of almsgiving.

Leprosy isolates...so does sin. Jesus wraps His arms around us and forgives us, heals us, loves us... if we let Him.

STEWARDSHIP & OBEYING THE LORD...

Often one of our human weaknesses has to do with us believing or thinking we know better than God in relation to what we do, and what we do in relation to others. Of course, part of that has to do with our failure to pray and consult the Lord, or even more to make no effort to understand what God may be telling us.

In today's Gospel Reading from *Saint Mark*, we hear about Jesus curing a leper. In His instructions to the cured man, He says, **See that you tell no one anything.** Of course, the man pays no attention to this instruction from the Lord. Instead, *The man went away and began to publicize the whole matter*

Surely the man meant well; in fact, he probably thought he was helping Jesus, but the reality as stated in the Gospel is that his disobedience hindered the ministry of Jesus, “so that it was impossible for Jesus to enter a town openly.” We need to obey the Lord, and we should never think we have a better plan than He does.

Even the eminent scientist, **Albert Einstein**, recognized how important Jesus' teachings are. **Einstein** said, *As a child I received instruction both in the Bible and in the Talmud. I am a Jew, but I am enthralled by the luminous figure of the Nazarene—no one can read the Gospels without feeling the actual presence of Jesus. His personality pulsates in every word. No myth is filled with such life.* Ω

LENT

Our observance of **Lent begins on Ash Wednesday**, a day of fast and abstinence for Catholics. At Mass on **Ash Wednesday**, the imposition of ashes replicates an ancient penitential practice and symbolizes our dependence upon God's mercy and forgiveness.

What is the Church's official position concerning penance and abstinence from meat during Lent?

LENTEN REGULATIONS:

Fasting as explained by the U.S. Bishops means partaking of only one full meal. Some food (*not equaling another full meal*) is permitted at breakfast and around midday or in the evening, depending on when a person chooses to eat the full meal. To sum up these requirements:

Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. In addition, ALL Catholics 14 years old and older must abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent.

EXEMPTIONS FROM THE LENTEN FAST:

Besides those outside the age limits, those of unsound mind, the sick, the frail, pregnant or nursing women according to need for meat or nourishment, manual laborers according to need, guests at a meal who cannot excuse themselves without giving great offense or causing enmity and other situations of moral or physical impossibility to observe the penitential discipline.

The key to fruitful observance of the three traditional Lenten practices of **prayer, fasting and almsgiving** is to recognize their link to our baptismal renewal. We are called not just to abstain from sin during Lent, but to true conversion of our hearts and minds as followers of Jesus Christ. We recall those waters in which we were baptized into Christ's death, died to sin and evil and began new life in Christ!

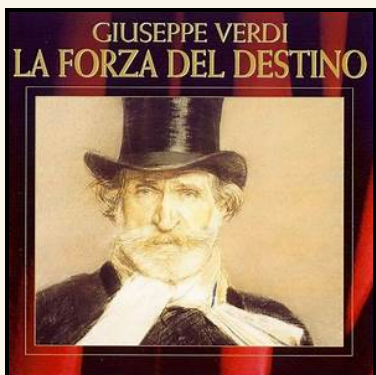
