After My Own Heart...

Have you ever visited a cemetery and seen a gravestone with a poignant epitaph of the person buried there? It's not uncommon to see descriptions like "Devoted Mother" or "Beloved Friend" on these markers. In the distant future, what would you want someone to read etched on your tombstone? What epitaph would summarize the best part of your life? In the Second Reading today, we discover how history remembered mighty King David. In a sermon to a primarily Jewish group, the apostle Paul referred to David, who was well known to the audience. Remembering all of the king's great accomplishments during his reign, how did Paul choose to describe him? He declared that David was the one person whom God called "a man after His own heart." What does it mean to be a person after God's own heart? For David, it required an intimate relationship with his Father. This entails much more than simply a regular routine of rote prayers...as good as they are.... and church attendance. Rather, such intimacy is founded upon an intense yearning to grow as close to our loving Lord as possible. What would it take for you to be described as a man or woman after God's own heart? What behaviors would need to be removed from your life? What would need to be added? Ask God for His help in making these adjustments—and for the commitment to make this epitaph the goal of your life.

STEWARDSHIP & TRUST...

Today is the *Solemnity of the Nativity of Saint John the Baptist* (the Feast Day of the birth of **John the Baptist**). To say **John the Baptist** and Jesus were closely related and connected is an understatement.

Both were foretold by prophets, especially Isaiah. The only record of the birth of John the Baptist appears in the *Gospel of Luke* and it is at the heart of our Gospel Reading today. A key player in this event is, of course, John the Baptist’s father **Zechariah**. **Zechariah** was a Jewish priest, but when the **Archangel Gabriel** revealed to him that he would father a child, **Zechariah** refused to believe it. As a result he was rendered speechless until **John** was born.

Zechariah had total trust in the Lord, however. Although it was traditional at that time to name the first son after the father, he and **Elizabeth** had been told that they were to name him John. As reported in the Gospel, **Elizabeth** said “He will be called **John**.” The family protested at which time **Zechariah** wrote “His name is John.” When he did that, **Zechariah** could speak once more. He did not say “should be”; he said “is.” The trust shown by **Zechariah** is an example to us that we must trust in God, not just when it is convenient, but all the time. Those of advanced generations know who **Lawrence Welk** was. Born and raised Catholic, **Welk** practiced his faith throughout his life. He once said, **Never trust anyone completely but God. Love people, but put your full trust only in God.** Ω



STEWARDSHIP, PETER & PAUL...



Next Friday we celebrate the **Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul, Apostles**. It is appropriate for us to commemorate these two pillars of our Church. **St. Augustine** said some 1,600 years ago: *Both apostles share the same feast day; for these two were one, and even though they suffered on different days they were as one...Let us embrace what they believed: their life, their labors, their sufferings, their preaching, and their confession of faith.*

On this Solemnity in 2013 **Pope Francis** included in his sermon the three reasons he rejoices at the lives of **Saints Peter and Paul**. In the Gospel **Peter** proclaims his faith in stating, *You are the Christ, the Son of the living God.* His Holiness pointed out the first reason is faith, *Faith in Christ is the light of our life as Christians.* He detailed the second reason as love. He cited **Paul** from the second reading saying, *I have finished the race; I have kept the faith.* Then he challenged each of us: *It is your task to go outside of yourselves in the love and service of the holy people of God.* His final reason was unity (not uniformity he explained). He detailed himself as the successor of **Peter**, and as **Paul** as well. **Pope Francis** felt each of them and each of us is part of the great mosaic of the Church. Viewed individually we are not defined, but all together as Church we present a clear picture of God’s plan. Are you, as a steward, fulfilling your part to present the Church as one? Ω

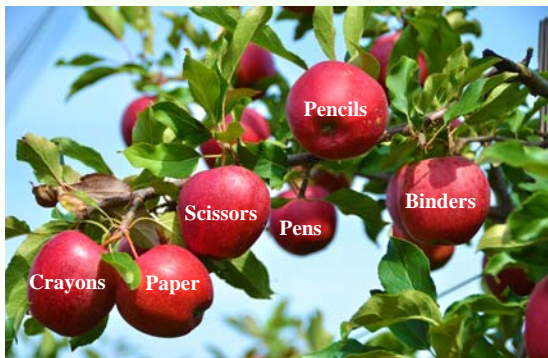
MUSIC MINISTRY... Take Note!
