According to Paul, the Corinthians became proficient in this too, especially regarding his ministry. The passage today from Paul, is his attempt to both explain and defend himself. Voicing a complaint need not be harmful. It is actually psychologically healthy to let off some steam. If we do not do this, resentment and crankiness eventually develop. Even Jesus vented once in a while (my disciples do not understand my message; people keep asking for signs; the temple is overflowing with money changers). However, once complaints are voiced, that's it—done and over with. When the same complaints keep being voiced, they turn into whining. This is when our spiritual life takes a dive. We lose perspective and begin blaming and verbally attacking others, forgetting that God guides our life, much like the people of Corinth did when they became consumed with grumbling about Paul.

STEWARDSHIP & TIME...

Today’s Gospel passage reminds us that life is precious and the gift of time on this earth is just that — a gift. None of us knows how much time will be granted to us, so it is urgent that we use this gift intentionally to glorify God and serve our neighbor.

Jesus offers the parable of the fig tree to further illustrate this truth. The owner of the orchard came searching for fruit on a fig tree he had planted in his orchard. Finding no fruit on the tree after three years, he told the gardener to cut it down. But the gardener intercedes and asks for one more year to cultivate and fertilize the tree in hopes it would bear fruit in the future. The fig tree was not dying; it simply wasn’t doing much of anything at all. Can this be said of us and our lives as well?

The season of Lent is a time to reflect carefully on the way we spend our time. Do we give first priority to God, tending to our spiritual growth and sacramental life with diligence? Do we give next priority to our loved ones, focusing intentionally on them each day without distractions from phones, screens or thoughts of work? If not, now is the moment to repent of our waste of time or of misplaced priorities on our use of time. God is merciful but just. Let’s turn to Him and ask Him to make our lives fruitful while we still have time to do so. Ω



STEWARDSHIP & DAILY SUGGESTIONS...

One of the hallmarks of any Lent is prayer. Here at St. Bernadette we offer many opportunities for prayer, especially during the Lenten season. One of those prospects for prayer is the *Stations of the Cross*.

The *Stations of the Cross* is a Lenten devotion that offers witness to Jesus’ Passion and Death. At each station we use our senses and our imagination to reflect prayerfully upon Jesus’ suffering, death, and resurrection, and to simply experience the visual images to reflect on Christ’s love for us. We have the stations on the walls of our interior church; we also have outdoor stations behind the grotto. As an act of stewardship, parishioners are updating, improving, and repairing our Outdoor Stations. Pictured above are superb parishioners and stewards, **Ray Sierra** and **Joe Lisboa**, who along with **John Francavilla** did the work. We salute and thank them all.

We continue to offer suggestions of ways to live out Lent effectively.

March 25: Thank a bishop, priest or member of a religious congregation for their public witness; invite them out for coffee or a meal.

March 26: Learn about the life of a saint, perhaps our parish saint, St. Bernadette.

March 27: Visit someone who’s alone.

March 28: Reflect on the most pressing challenges confronting our Church and pray for a Spirit-filled response.

March 29: Attend the Stations of the Cross.

March 30: Pray for our Holy Father, Pope Francis.

March 31: Find out the name of a person participating in our parish’s RCIA program and send a note of encouragement. Ω
